Don Hughes told about Hughesovka, the Welsh city near Donetsk in Ukraine, named for John Hughes of Merthyr Tydfil, who at the request of the Russian government in 1868 took 100 Welsh miners and steel workers to the Donbass region to create an ironworks similar to one he headed in London. WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH:

"A century ago almost 400,000 women in Wales signed a petition to be sent to the women of the United States urging them to demand

that the US join the League of Nations, work together "in a limitation of naval armaments", stop the trafficking of women and drugs, and join the Permanent Court of International Justice. Three Welsh women traveled to the US and presented the appeal to leaders of many of the leading women's organizations; they also met President Coolidge. The petition has been housed in the National Museum of America since those days. Today Women in Wales, and in North America, are preparing to remember, celebrate and realize the dream for a warless world."

WALES OPENING HOMES TO UKRAINIANS: From the Welsh Government Website: "The UK Government has set up two routes for people fleeing the war in Ukraine to seek safety and sanctuary in the UK and Wales.

If people in Ukraine have family ties in the UK they can apply for a visa through the <u>Ukraine Family Scheme</u>. This scheme allows people to join their family members or extend their stay in the UK. It is free to apply and people will be able to live, work and study in the UK and access public funds.

The other route is the <u>Homes for Ukraine</u> scheme, which is specially designed for people in Ukraine who do not have family links in the UK. It allows people in the UK to sponsor someone in Ukraine to come and live in the UK.

People in Wales can sign up for the Homes for Ukraine scheme, offer to become a sponsor and offer a space in their home to someone fleeing the conflict in Ukraine to live for at least six months. People signing up to the scheme via the <u>Homes for Ukraine website</u> can be matched with people escaping the war in Ukraine who want to come to the UK."

<u>HUGHESOVSKA</u>: "Within two years, John Hughes' team had eight blast furnaces up and running. Collieries, mines, brickworks and rail lines followed. So did churches, hospitals, a school and a fire brigade. By the time of Hughes's death in 1889, aged 75, the site had become a city. And in Russian fashion, it bore the name of its "creator" – Hughesovka. It was renamed Stalina in 1942." Now as we're all thinking of Ukraine under attack, it's remarkable to learn about the former Welsh community in the eastern Donbass region, near the Russian border.
